Development of the Mobile Fishing Permit Byelaw Permit Conditions for Formal Consultation

Revocation and the re-making of the Mobile Fishing Permit Byelaw (and associated Permit Conditions) is a Key Task (KT103) in D&S IFCA's 2022-2023 Annual Plan. Drafting, in preparation for formal consultation on the Byelaw and Permit Conditions, is at a relatively advanced stage; however further decision making of the Byelaw and Permitting Sub-Committee (B&PSC) is required to complete the work. In the decisions making process the B&PSC should not only consider the duties under Marine and Coastal Access Act 2009 (MaCAA), but also the objectives set out within the <u>Fisheries Act 2020</u>.

<u>A 5 Year Review Mobile Byelaw Report</u>, dated 30th July 2019, was presented to the B&PSC on 19th August 2019, which detailed areas under discussion. This paper provides further information, which was requested and recorded in the <u>B&PSC minutes</u> of that meeting.
