## **Bass Restrictions for 2019**

In 2019 the restrictions for catching bass by recreational fishers is a zero take – Catch and Release only.



Following the December Council of Fisheries meeting, the new TAC (Total Allowable Catch) regulations are expected to be published during January 2019. It is expected that a bag limit of one fish per day from the 1<sup>st</sup> April to 31<sup>st</sup> October 2019 will be implemented for recreational fishers.

## What does this mean?

• In the meantime, the current Bass regulations still apply

From the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2019, recreational fishers are not allowed to retain any Bass when fishing. Any Bass caught must be immediately returned to the water. Although not a specific D&S IFCA Byelaw, IFCA officers can assist the Marine Management Organisation (MMO) in enforcing this EU Bass legislation. The Minimum Conservation Reference Size (MCRS) for Bass remains at **42cm**. For a list of fish and shellfish sizes, see our <u>Minimum Size Guide</u>.
