Catch and Release of Bass Starts on 1st December 2020

As of 1st December 2020, all bass caught by recreational fishermen must be returned to the sea immediately if caught.



Council Regulation (EU) 2020/123 was released on the 27th January 2020. Article 10 specifies the measures on European seabass fisheries. These are not byelaw restrictions introduced by D&S IFCA, but they do apply within the D&S IFCA District.

Following nine months of a two fish per day bag limit for recreational fishers, a period of catch and release will apply from 1st December 2020. During the periods of catch and release, recreational fishers are not allowed to retain any bass. Any bass caught must be immediately returned to the water. Although not a specific D&S IFCA Byelaw, D&S IFCA officers can assist the Marine Management Organisation (MMO) in enforcing this EU Bass legislation. The Restrictions:

- January, February and December, it is catch and release only for recreational fishers.
- Two bass fish per fisher, per day during the months March to November inclusive.
- Fixed nets cannot be used to catch or retain bass.
