Commercial & Recreational Sea Bass Fishing Guidance

Updated Bass catch restrictions for the commercial sector – Updated 25th May 2022

As of the 25th of May 2022, the Council Regulation (EU) 2020/123 has been amended to reflect new catch limits.



What has changed?

The Council regulation (EU) 2020/123 fixing for 2020 the fishing opportunities for certain fish stocks and groups of fish stocks, applicable in Union waters and, for Union fishing vessels, in certain non-Union waters is amended as follows.

- Demersal trawls and seines- unavoidable bycatch not exceeding 760kg in any two consecutive months and 5% of the weight of total catches per trip.
- Hooks and lines- not exceeding 5.95 tonnes per vessel per year
- Fixed gillnets by-catches not exceeding 1.5 tonnes per vessel per year

Recreational Fishing

It is important to note that the regulations regarding recreational Bass fishing have not changed and remain the same. Key restrictions include the following:

- Bass may only be retained between 1st March and the end of November in each calendar year.
- Two Bass may be retained per person, per day within this period.
- Bass retained must measure at least the Minimum Conservation Reference Size of 42cm in length.
- Fixed nets cannot be used to catch or retain Bass.
- These rules apply when fishing from a boat or from the shore.
