Commercial Fishing Social Survey

Join the workshops to have your say and help develop the survey.



The Countryside and Community Research Institute (CCRI) at the University of Gloucestershire are working with partners from "Fishing into the Future" to develop an annual nationwide social survey of commercial fisheries that aims to support fisheries management. The survey will collect data on health and wellbeing, cultural identity, community, traditions, and values.

The Defra-funded project, supported by the <u>Seafarers' Charity</u>, aims to inform development of a national-scale survey of commercial fisheries. This vision is to design the survey in a coproduced way, whereby key industry stakeholders have an opportunity to say what they feel needs to be included.

Workshops

The team want to hear directly from fishermen and people working in the catching sector on the priorities and issues to include in the survey and will be holding in-person workshops in Newlyn, Bridlington, Newhaven, and Wells-next-the-sea, as well as online sessions in May 2023.
