Based in Carnforth, Lancashire - this is a permanent contract with a salary range between £24,496 and £28,371. Although more detail can be found on [NW IFCA's website](#), some of the key information is set out below.

Job Purpose:

This is a varied role that includes enforcement of IFCA byelaws, EC and National fisheries legislation. Other elements include assisting with a variety of fisheries and marine environmental projects. The post holder will develop communications with the Authority (NW IFCA), the media and stakeholders through creative use and management of various resources.

Working Hours:

37 hours per week (Flexi-time system in operation). The post involves working un-social hours, including early mornings, late evenings and weekends as required by tides and enforcement/communication duties.

Requirements:

This includes a mixture of essential and desirable attributes based around qualifications, experience, knowledge, technical skills, and personal attributes. The candidate must have a minimum of 5 GCSEs or equivalent including English and Mathematics. Seamanship qualifications such as an RYA Powerboat Certificate (level 2) are desirable.
