Devon and Severn IFCA Introduces New Potting Permit Byelaw Permit Conditions.

D&S IFCA is in the process of circulating new Potting Permit Conditions to all fishers that already had a Potting Permit on 9th August 2018.



The new permits are accompanied by four <u>Annexes</u> (Charts) that relate to the relevant paragraphs in the <u>Potting Permit Conditions</u>. When this circulation process is complete, previous versions of the conditions will no longer valid. New applicants will also receive the new permits.

What's new?

Key changes include:

- 1. New Potting Permit Conditions to replace a reliance on the deeming clause;
- 2. New Potting Permit Conditions for the protection of spiny lobster that has recently cast it shell;
- 3. New Potting Permit Conditions to prohibit the removal of spiny lobster from MCZ areas;
- 4. New Potting Permit Conditions to protect populations of otters within estuaries;
- 5. New Potting Permit Conditions to introduce a 65mm minimum conservation reference size for whelk:
- 6. New Potting Permit Conditions to introduce a restriction for the Lundy Island No Take Zone;
- 7. Some Changes to Category Two Permit Conditions. (Gear Only 5 pots can be hauled in any day which must be their own pots)

How and why were the Potting Permits changed?

The changes are all part of the mandatory three-year review of the Potting Permit Conditions. A lengthy process was undertaken which included wide spread consultation. The whole process and decision making by the D&S IFCA Byelaw & Permitting Sub-Committee has been documented in a report.
