## Invitation for Commercial Fishermen to Join Workshop in Brixham

The workshop is to help understand the social and cultural benefits of commercial fisheries for making decisions/developing policy.

Researchers from the University of Gloucestershire have contacted D&S IFCA about some key work they are carrying out on behalf of the Marine Management Organisation (MMO). D&S IFCA is helping to inform fishermen about a workshop being held in Brixham on Tuesday 16th January 2024.

The advisory and consultancy company, ICF, and the Countryside and Community Research Institute (CCRI) at the University of Gloucestershire are carrying out research on behalf of the looking at demonstrating the social and cultural value of commercial fisheries.



The project aims to identify the range of social/cultural benefits resulting from small-scale, local, fisheries (for individual fishers, their families, and wider communities), and understand the barriers towards their realisation. This knowledge will assist the MMO in making more innovative management decisions to support fisheries in the future. The research provides a real opportunity to get involved in work that aims to make a difference to communities. Brixham has been chosen as a case study area.

As part of the project, the research team are holding a workshop in Brixham with members of the commercial fishing industry in the area and (up to) one family member. They would greatly appreciate your involvement by attending the workshop in January. The details of when and where are below.
