

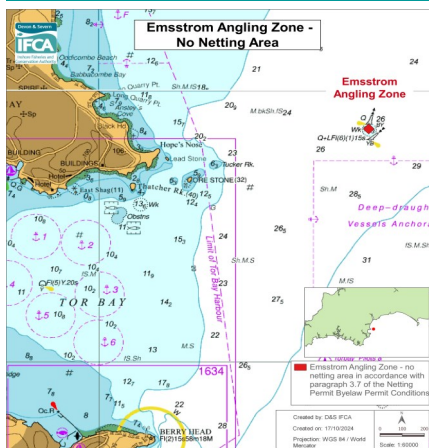
## ***Emsstrom Wreck: Angling Zone***

**This Angling Zone has been developed by Devon and Severn IFCA in recognition of the importance and value of recreational sea angling and to secure the wreck for current and future angling activities.**

**Fishing Mark:** A 77m vessel which sank in 2013.

**Species:** The fish fauna is developing and it is likely to include cod, pollack, conger and bass.

**Location:** East of Hopes Nose (Torbay).

## Legislation: Netting

The Netting Permit Conditions prohibit commercial and recreational netting in this area.

## Voluntary Code: Longlining and Potting

- No longlines (for commercial or recreational purposes) are permitted.
- No potting of any kind is permitted.

## Recreational Angling

- Make sure you are aware of D&S IFCA Byelaws and other legislation such as bass regulations.
- Be aware that angling clubs often have larger minimum sizes that you may wish to adhere to.
- Handle all fish carefully particularly those you intend to return to the sea alive. Guidance for fish handling can be found on-line.
