Budget Monitoring Month 4

In December 2024, the authority agreed to the use of reserves of £118,042 to balance the budget for 2025/26. The approved budget was prepared on the basis the authority would not receive any additional grant funding for the year.

At month 4, there is currently a projected transfer from general reserve of £66,342, rather than the original budgeted £118,042. This is mainly due to receiving one off additional grant income of £50,000 from DEFRA.

There is an expected underspend in supplies and services, due to a saving in advertising costs, partially offset by an overspend in enforcement.
